Of peace on earth, good-will to men!


And in despair I bowed my head;



**Session Highlights from November Meeting**

- The Session of the Middle Spring Presbyterian Church met for their regular meeting on Tuesday, November 3, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. All members of session were present.

**The Clerk's Report for November included the following information:**


- World Communion was celebrated on October 4, with Pastor Kim officiating. Viewers were invited to participate at home, in accordance with guidance from our denomination.
- It is reported that Thelma Cover Brenize died on Thursday, October 15, 2020. (She was born on May 26, 1929 and joined Middle Spring Presbyterian Church on October 11, 1992.) She was ordained as a deacon on January 10, 1999. A private memorial service was held on October 20, 2020 at Middle Spring Presbyterian Church with The Rev. Kimberley D. Wadlington officiating. Burial was in Parklawns Memorial Gardens.
- Rev. Bruce Humphrey was guest preacher on 10-25 in a pre-recorded message, when Pastor Kim was on vacation.
- Pastor Kim and Commissioner Pat Mahan attended the 10-3 Stated Meeting of the Presbytery, held through Zoom.
- On October 19, Pastor Kim and Pat Mahan attended a Zoom meeting offered through Presbytery on how to handle congregational meetings and election of officers under current conditions.

**No new report of the Treasurer as of the end of October 2020 was available this early in the month.**

Last month's newsletter shared General Fund Summaries for August and September. Full financial reports always available in the church office.

**The Moderator's Report summarizing Pastor Kim's activity for the month of October was received.****Action Approved by Session** (info only items about the work of ministries is found in other parts of newsletter):

- Upon the recommendation of the Worship Ministry, Session approved pre-recording the Christmas Eve worship service, which would make the service available for viewing throughout the day.
- Also upon the recommendation of the Worship Ministry, Session approved holding a gathering in the parking lot at 8:00 p.m. on Christmas Eve for candle lighting and the singing of two hymns ("Joy to the World" and "Silent Night"), with social distancing but no musical accompaniment.
- Upon the recommendation of the Personnel Committee, approval was given to pay \$20 per hour to the individual providing technology/media assistance for the virtual broadcasting of the worship service, retroactive to October 1. It is recognized by Session that this assistance is essential if Middle Spring is to continue to make the service available online, and it is expected that several individuals will share the responsibility from week to week. (Hours will be reported to Ray Staver, chair of Personnel.)
- The newly amended Wedding Policy was approved.
- Having had the opportunity before the meeting to review the proposed budget for 2021, Session voted to divide the \$32,544 under Mission (which represents 12% of the 2020 budget) in this way: \$18,844 for Carlisle Presbytery, \$2500 for the Honduras Mission Co-worker, \$1200 for the General Assembly Mission Agency, and \$10,000 for Local Mission. After doing this, Session voted to approve the Proposed 2021 Budget to send to the congregation.
- Session discussed the changes that will need to be made in conducting the business of the Annual Meeting this year because of the health and safety precautions in place at this time. It was agreed that the By-Laws need to be amended to permit a meeting that would be held both in-person in the sanctuary and virtually through Zoom but with simultaneous aural communication. Session approved bringing the recommended changes in the By-Laws to the congregation at the Annual Meeting.
- Session approved moving the Annual Meeting from November 8 to November 22, 2020, in order that the necessary additional preparation can be completed.
- The 2021 Calendar was approved by Session.
- Commissioners elected to attend the December 1 Presbytery Meeting on Zoom are Kathy Bierbower and Jeannie Chamberlin.


