



Greetings! May the peace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all! This month I write to share with you the priorities that session has set thus for the church this year. We want you to know where we hope we're headed and to pray about your role in each of these priorities. Session identified three priorities to explore for the year thus far:

- 1. The continuation of on-line worship.** Session, initially with the help of the Worship Ministry, is exploring whether or not to continue on-line worship even after all are able to gather in person safely. There are a lot of questions to be answered as we ponder this, chief among them: What is our goal/vision for having worship on-line? Once we have goals and a vision, we can work with a technology company to figure out how to make them happen and decide if we wish to incur the cost. The cost includes both financial commitment AND the commitment of people willing to be a part of a team that makes online worship possible each week.
- 2. Continuing exploring a building addition.** Our building addition exploration has basically been on hold since the beginning of Covid. Since our January meeting, session has received a summary of where we are in the process and will be deciding next steps. Of course, any decisions about a building will come before the congregation when a plan is ready.
- 3. Signage for the church.** Session wishes to have additional signage for the church out on the by-way (Route 696) and perhaps also in front of our church. A member of session has begun exploring land usage, township regulations, and other issues as well and we hope to have a sign on the by-way soon. We'll begin exploring a new sign for the church property as well.

A 4th priority that overarches these three was also identified, the priority of engaging in more "outreach." At our next session meeting we'll explore what we mean by "outreach" and how each of our ministries - worship, growth, service, and stewardship - play a role in encouraging and engaging in "outreach."

As we explore these priorities, I ask each of you to think about your own role in the life of the church and where you feel called to serve both within and without.

- An immediate need is being part of a worship technology team. Training is available! Would you like to volunteer to learn the technology used for livestreaming worship? It takes three people and we have a team of three faithful people. We need backups starting as soon as possible for the times those three are unable to be present in worship. We also need people willing to do some other behind the scenes work necessary for live-streaming worship.
- There may be need for leadership with the building addition exploration as well. If you are someone who is excited about the possibility of a building addition we have need of you!

Please let a member of session or Pastor Kim know if you wish to be of service in any of these areas. We are Middle Spring church called together by God! That means each of you has a role to play in our life and ministry together. Peace!

Session Highlights from January Meeting

The Session of the Middle Spring Presbyterian Church met for their regular meeting on Tuesday, January 5, 2021 at 7:00 p.m. All members of session were present. After a sharing of prayer joys and concerns, Pastor Kim led devotions. *The Minutes of the Regular Meeting on December 7 were approved as corrected.*

The Clerk's Report for November included the following information:

- Continuing the practice begun on March 15, Sunday worship in the month of December was offered live at 10:30 a.m. through Facebook and was available on the church's YouTube channel and website. In-person worship in the sanctuary was suspended beginning December 13 following the action of the Session at the December 7 meeting.
- Advent Communion was celebrated on December 6, with Pastor Kim officiating. Viewers were invited to participate at home, in accordance with guidance from our denomination.
- The Christmas Eve Candlelight Service was pre-recorded and made available for viewing online early on December 24. Individuals had been encouraged to submit short video segments showing the lighting of candles in their homes, and these videos were included in the service.
- A small group also gathered in the church parking lot at 8 p.m. on December 24 to light candles and sing "Silent Night" and "Joy to the World."
- It is reported that Carolyn Ann ("Susie") Maclay died on Saturday, December 19, 2020. A graveside service was held on December 23, 2020 with interment in the Middle Spring Presbyterian Church Cemetery.

The Report of the Treasurer for November showed the following information:

- Year-to-date income \$240,700.27; year-to-date expenses \$217,565.79 \$23,134.48
- Check book balance \$111,481.49; available cash \$54,009.31; e-giving \$2,048.60 in Nov.

The Moderator's Report summarizing Pastor Kim's activity for the month of December was received.

The Report of the Deacons Meeting on December 8 was accepted with thanks.


BUSINESS:*Information Items:*

- The Service Ministry has dispersed the funds designated for local mission. A list of the organizations receiving these funds can be found at the end of the minutes. *See page 5*
- Session identified three chief priorities to be addressed in the coming year: (1) online worship, (2) the renovation process, and (3) outreach, specifically identifying signage as a need right now. Session will continue work to address challenges and opportunities in each of these areas. See the cover letter for more information.
- The Spring Congregation-Corporation Meeting will take place in March this year.
- Several night lights will be placed in the sanctuary and narthex to improve safety in accessing the light switch located in the narthex.

Action approved by Session:

- Upon the recommendation of the Buildings and Grounds Committee, Session approved the placement of a camera on the wall in the sanctuary. It will make it possible to avoid a tripping hazard when filming the organist.
- Session voted to pay up to \$600 annually for a streaming service that would make it possible to stream the Sunday worship service to both Facebook and YouTube simultaneously. This would make access both easier and more reliable. Derek Wadlington will do the background research on this.
- The request from Charles "Woody" Kelso to remove his name from the membership roll was approved (with sadness).
- Concerns of the congregation were lifted up in closing prayer.


